Tryouts – Frequently Asked Questions

1. When & Where are tryouts?

2. How do I register?

You can register online here: https://covingtonsoccer.com/index/covington-fc/tryouts/ Walk-up registrations may be accepted, but pre-registration is highly encouraged to ensure a smooth check-in process.

3. What should players bring to tryouts?

- Cleats
- Shin guards (mandatory)
- Water bottle

4. What happens during tryouts?

Players will be evaluated in the following areas:

- Technical skills (dribbling, passing, shooting)
- Tactical understanding
- Fitness and agility
- Attitude, effort, and coachability

5. Can parents watch tryouts?

Yes, parents are welcome to watch from the sidelines. We kindly ask that you do not coach or communicate with the players during the sessions to allow coaches to evaluate fairly.

6. What if my child can't attend the scheduled tryout?

7. How many tryout sessions does my child need to attend?

Players are encouraged to attend all scheduled tryout sessions for their age group to ensure a thorough and fair evaluation.

8. When will players be notified?

- 11U-13U invitations begin Saturday, May 3
- 14U–19U invitations begin Saturday, June 7
- Invitations will continue through the weekend following each opening date

9. What if my child does not make the top-level team?

Many age groups have multiple teams, and players are placed based on current ability and developmental needs.

- All teams receive quality coaching and opportunities for growth
- Players are re-evaluated each year and may be promoted to higher-level teams as they improve
- We believe in rewarding effort, attitude, and commitment

10. How many teams will there be in each age group?

The number of teams depends on tryout participation.

- Some age groups may have multiple teams
- Players are re-evaluated each season and may be promoted to higher-level teams through effort and performance

11. What is the training schedule?

Training schedules vary depending on the age group and team.

- Most teams train 2 to 3 times per week
- Final schedules are determined after team formation and coordinated by each coach

12. What is the time commitment for competitive soccer?

- 2 to 3 training sessions per week (1 to 1.5 hours each)
- The number of games varies by age group
- Most teams participate in 2 tournaments per season (1 local, 1 out of town)

13. Where are games typically played?

- Most games are within a 60-mile radius of Covington
- About 50% of games are away matches

14. What is the cost of competitive soccer at Covington FC?

- The 2025/26 fees are TBD
 - o 2024/25 fees were \$900/year (includes training, some referee fees, and equipment)
- Fees do not include uniforms or tournament fees
- Two uniform kits are required per player
- Flexible payment plans and scholarship opportunities are available

15. How is CFC competitive soccer different from Juniors Academy?

In the Competitive program, playing time is earned based on performance in training and games, as determined by the coaching staff.

- Coaches consider skill, effort, attitude, and game impact when determining playing time.
- Unlike the Academy program, there is no guaranteed 50% playing time.
- Players who consistently work hard and perform well will earn more minutes.
